CITY OF SEATTLE

RESOLUTION 31834

A RESOLUTION expressing The City of Seattle's opposition to offshore oil and gas drilling and exploration activities, including seismic airgun blasting.

WHEREAS, in Washington State hundreds of thousands of jobs and billions of dollars of the state's gross domestic product depend on clean, oil-free water and beaches and abundant fish and wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of Washington State's ocean wealth stems from fishing, aquaculture, tourism, and recreation, all of which benefit from a healthy ocean and coast; and

WHEREAS, offshore oil and gas drilling places coastal communities at risk from oil spills and the pollution brought by onshore industrialization, threatening the livelihoods of commercial and recreational fisherman and small businesses that rely on a clean and healthy ocean and beaches; and

WHEREAS, offshore drilling may require significant onshore infrastructure, such as pipelines or refineries, which would harm the character of Washington State's coastline and could exacerbate wetlands loss and storm surge and sea level rise impacts; and

WHEREAS, the harmful impacts from offshore oil and gas drilling and exploration anywhere along the Pacific coastline could extend far beyond immediately surrounding areas and severely impact communities that rely on the robust economy of the marine industry; and

WHEREAS, offshore drilling and exploration perpetuates dependence on dirty carbon pollution and contributes to climate change and the resulting sea level rise and extreme weather; and

1 WHEREAS, the Trump administration has expressed interest in opening the Pacific Ocean to
2 offshore oil and gas drilling and exploration, including the use of seismic airguns, which
3 fire intense blasts of compressed air that rank just behind military explosives as the
4 loudest source of noise in the ocean, every ten to 12 seconds, 24 hours a day, for months
5 on end; and

6 WHEREAS, seismic airgun blasting to explore for oil and gas deposits has been proven to
7 disrupt and displace marine life, such as whales and orcas that rely on sound to find food
8 and mates, and can impair the health of many fish and shellfish species, including those
9 of commercial importance like rockfish, crab, and oysters; and


10 WHEREAS, The City of Seattle recognizes that its communities, businesses, and industries
11 depend on a healthy coastal environment for the benefit of current and future residents,
12 property owners, and visitors; NOW, THEREFORE,

13 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**
14 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**

15 Section 1. The City of Seattle finds that offshore oil and gas drilling and exploration
16 unnecessarily risks economic and ecological health and therefore opposes any plan or legislation
17 that encourages oil and gas development and exploration offshore that would impact the
18 residents of Washington State.


19 Section 2. The Mayor and City Council firmly oppose offshore oil and gas drilling and
20 exploration, and call on the Governor of Washington, the state legislative delegation, and the
21 federal congressional delegation to take all steps possible to prohibit and prevent such actions.
22 The City further calls on the Trump Administration, including the federal Bureau of Ocean
23 Energy Management, to halt such activity.

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
